Here are some programs to help you with your natural gas heating bills while remaining warm and comfortable throughout the heating season.

Programs that can help you with your heating bills

Many of the programs listed below are administered through your local Community Action Agency. To find your local agency, visit cngc.com/customer-service/low-income-assistance-programs.

Budget Payment Plan

Budget Payment Plan: This payment plan helps you budget your energy expenses by paying an even monthly amount throughout the year, as opposed to paying larger bills in the winter when you use more natural gas.

Oregon Low-Income Bill Assistance program: This program is funded through a public purpose charge on your monthly natural gas bill. It provides additional assistance to income-qualified households that are struggling to pay their natural gas bills. Applications are accepted at your local Community Action Agency.



Winter Help: This program is a Cascade Natural Gas –and customer–funded program partnered with the local Community Action agencies. It is designed to

help our neighbors with temporary heating emergencies. To apply for a grant, contact your local Community Action Agency. To contribute to the fund please visit www.cngc.com to complete a contribution form.

LIHEAP: Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program is a federally funded program that provides a one-time (per program year) benefit to assist with heating costs.

Applications are taken at your local Community Action Agency.

WEAF

Washington Energy Assistance Fund (WEAF):

This Washington fund is provided to assist qualified low-income customers with utility bill assistance. Applications are accepted at your local Community Action Agency.
